## Grants...

### U.S. Department of Agriculture – Rural Community Development Initiative

Grants under this program will be made to qualified intermediary organizations that will provide financial and technical assistance to recipients to develop their capacity and ability to undertake projects related to housing, community facilities, or community and economic development that will support the community. The program is funded as part of the Rural Community Development Initiative under the Rural Housing Service, an agency within the USDA Rural Development mission area. Applicants must provide matching funds in an amount at least equal to the federal grant. **Deadline for applications is July 22.** [More information >](#)

### MoDOT – Missouri Moves Cost Share Program Funding Now Available

The Missouri Department of Transportation is seeking projects that could be funded with the Missouri Moves Cost Share Program. The purpose of the Missouri Moves Cost Share Program is to build partnerships with local entities to pool efforts and resources to deliver transportation projects. The program also provides financial assistance to public and private applicants for state and local projects satisfying a transportation need. Eligible projects include roads, bridges, bicycle/pedestrian accommodations and multimodal facilities. A total of \$20 million is available and the **application period ends July 29.** [More information >](#)

### EPA – Brownfields Area-Wide Planning Grant

This funding is for research and/or technical assistance activities directed to one or more brownfield site(s) located in a specific area (such as a neighborhood, downtown or business district, local commercial corridor, community waterfront or city block). Each project funded under this grant must result in an area-wide plan which includes specific implementation strategies for assessing, cleaning up, and reusing the brownfields site(s) as well as related brownfields and project area revitalization strategies. EPA anticipates awarding approximately 20 projects in total, funded at up to \$200,000 each. The **deadline for submissions is Aug. 10.** [More information >](#)

### MoDOT – Traffic Engineering Assistance Program (TEAP) Funding Now Available

The Missouri Department of Transportation is seeking projects that could be funded with Traffic Engineering Assistance Program (TEAP). The TEAP allows local public agencies (LPA) to receive engineering assistance for studying traffic engineering problems. Typical traffic engineering related projects include corridor safety and/or operational analysis, intersection(s) safety and/or operational analysis, speed limit review, sign inventory, pedestrian/bike route analysis, parking issues, and other traffic studies. Funds administered by MoDOT will provide 80 percent of the TEAP project costs, up to \$8,000 per project, with local agencies contributing a 20 percent match. **Applications are due Sept. 9** and eligible projects must be able to be completed by spring of 2017. ### Missouri Main Street Grants

Missouri Main Street offers three matching grant programs providing up to 75 percent of the costs: Affiliate Grant, People Energizing Places (PEP), and Strategic Teams Engaging Places (STEP). These grant programs continue the mission of MMSC that is to provide the tools and resources for downtown revitalization to Missouri communities. MMSC is a 501(c)3 and financially supported by funding from the State of Missouri, Missouri Department of Economic Development, grants, sponsors, members, and other donations. ### Our Town Grant for the Arts

The Our Town program supports creative placemaking projects that help transform communities into lively, beautiful, and resilient places with the arts at their core. Creative Placemaking occurs when artists, arts organizations, and community development officials deliberately integrate the arts and culture into community revitalization work.

The National Endowment for the Arts will provide a limited number of grants for creative placemaking through the Our Town program in two areas: **1) Arts Engagement, Cultural Planning, and Design Projects** – matching grants from \$25,000 to \$200,000: projects represent the distinct character and quality of their communities and require a partnership between a nonprofit organization and local government entity. **2) Projects that Build Knowledge About Creative Placemaking** – matching grants from \$25,000 to \$100,000: Available to arts and design service organizations, as well as industry, policy, or university organizations that provide technical assistance to those doing place-based work.
